### HYMNS OF THE DAY

Tone 8. Troparion of the Resurrection

THOU didst des<u>cend</u> from on <u>high</u>, O <u>Mer</u>ciful One! \* Thou didst ac<u>cept</u> the <u>three</u> day <u>burial</u> \* to free us <u>from our suff</u>erings!// O Lord, our <u>Life</u> and Resur<u>rect</u>ion, <u>glory</u> to Thee!

Tone 7. Troparion of Transfiguration

YOU were transfigured upon the mount, O Christ our God, \* revealing Your glory to Your Disciples as much as they were able to bear. \* Let Your everlasting Light shine on us sinners, \* through the intercessions of the Birthgiver of God // O Giver of Light, glory to You!

Tone 4. Troparion of the church

TODAY the faithful celebrate the <u>feast</u> with joy \* il<u>lum</u>ined by your coming, O <u>Mo</u>ther of God. \* Beholding your pure image, we fervently <u>cry</u> to you: \* Encompass us beneath the precious veil of your protection. \* Deliver us from every form of <u>evil</u>, \* by entreating Christ, your <u>Son</u> and our <u>God</u>, // that He may <u>save</u> our <u>souls</u>!

Tone 4. Troparion of St. Lawrence

VICTORIOUS martyr of <u>Christ</u> our God, \* by the sign of the Cross thou didst give <u>sight</u> to the blind; \* thou didst distribute the riches of the <u>Church</u> to the poor; \* thou wast tried by fire, and no evil was <u>found</u> in thee. \* As thou didst endure <u>burn</u>ing, \* may thy prayers extinguish the flames of

our <u>many</u> sins, // blessed Archdeacon Lawrence!

Tone 8. Kontakion of the Resurrection

BY rising <u>from</u> the <u>tomb</u>, Thou didst raise the dead and resurrect <u>Adam</u>. \* Eve exults <u>in</u> Thy <u>Resurrection</u>, // and the world <u>cel</u>ebrates Thy <u>rising</u> from the dead, O greatly <u>Mer</u>ciful One!

Glory. Tone 2. Kontakion of St. Lawrence

THY <u>heart</u> burned with di<u>vine</u> fire, \* as the flames of the passions died with<u>in</u> thee. \* God-bearing <u>Mar</u>tyr Lawrence, the pillar of those who <u>struggle</u>, \* thou didst cry out in the midst of thy <u>contest</u>: // "Nothing can <u>sep</u>arate me from the love of Christ!"

Both now. Tone 7. Kontakion of Transfiguration

YOU were transfigured upon the mount, O Christ our God, \* revealing Your glory to Your Disciples as much as they were able to bear. \* So that when they saw You crucified \* they would know it voluntary \* and would proclaim to the ends of the earth // that You are the Light of the Father.

#### **EPISTLE**

### The Reading is from the First Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians (3:9-17)

Brethren, we are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, you are God's building. According to the grace of God which was given to me, as a wise master builder I have laid the foundation, and another builds on it. But let each one take heed how he builds on it. For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. Now if anyone builds on this foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw, each one's work will become clear; for the Day will declare it, because it will be revealed by fire; and the fire will test each one's work, of what sort it is. If anyone's work which he has built on it endures, he will receive a reward. If anyone's work is burned, he will suffer loss; but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire. Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone defiles the temple of God, God will destroy him. For the temple of God is holy, which temple you are.

### **GOSPEL**

### The Reading is from the Holy Gospel According to St. Matthew (14:22-34)

At that time, immediately Jesus made His disciples get into the boat and go

before Him to the other side, while He sent the multitudes away. And when He had sent the multitudes away, He went up on the mountain by Himself to pray. Now when evening came, He was alone there. But the boat was now in the middle of the sea, tossed by the waves, for the wind was contrary. Now in the fourth watch of the night Jesus went to them, walking on the sea. And when the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out for fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Be of good cheer! It is I; do not be afraid." And Peter answered Him and said. "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water." So He said, "Come." And when Peter had come down out of the boat, he walked on the water to go to Jesus. But when he saw that the wind was boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink he cried out, saying, "Lord, save me!" And immediately Jesus stretched out His hand and caught him, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased. Then those who were in the boat came and worshiped Him, saying, "Truly You are the Son of God." When they had crossed over, they came to the land of Gennesaret.

## INSTEAD OF "IT IS TRULY MEET"

In the fourth tone: Magnify, O my soul, the Lord Who was transfigured on Mount Tabor! \* Your childbearing was without corruption; \* God came forth from your body clothed in flesh, \* and appeared on earth and dwelt among men. // Therefore we all magnify you, O Theotokos.

## ABOUT THE AFTERFEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD

The hymns of Vespers remind us that the Transfiguration is not merely a historical event, but something which also has implications for us. Those who "desire to see and hear things past understanding" must ascend from earthly concerns to "the height of the contemplation of the virtues." This may be achieved by "directing our minds to heavenly things" and by "being formed anew in piety into the image of Christ."
