Tone 8. Troparion of the Resurrection

THOU didst des<u>cend</u> from on <u>high</u>, O <u>Mer</u>ciful One! * Thou didst ac<u>cept</u> the <u>three</u> day <u>bur</u>ial * to free us <u>from our suff</u>erings!// O Lord, our <u>Life</u> and Resur<u>rect</u>ion, <u>glory</u> to Thee!

Tone 4. Troparion of the Church

TODAY the faithful celebrate the <u>feast</u> with <u>joy</u> * il<u>lum</u>ined by your coming, O <u>Mo</u>ther of God. * Beholding your pure image, we fervently <u>cry</u> to you: * En<u>compass</u> us beneath the precious veil of your pro<u>tection</u>. * Deliver us from every form of <u>evil</u>, * by entreating Christ, your <u>Son</u> and our <u>God</u>, // that He may <u>save</u> our <u>souls</u>!

Tone 4. Troparion of St. Charitina

YOUR lamb Charitina calls out to You, O Jesus, in a <u>loud</u> voice: * "I love You, my Bridegroom, and in seeking You I endure <u>suf</u>fering. * In baptism I was crucified so that I might <u>reign</u> in You, * and I died so that I might <u>live</u> with You. * Accept me as a pure <u>sac</u>rifice, * for I have offered my<u>self</u> in love." // Through her prayers save our souls, since You are merciful!

Tone 8. Kontakion of the Resurrection

BY rising <u>from</u> the <u>tomb</u>, Thou didst raise the dead and resurrect <u>Adam</u>. * Eve exults <u>in</u> Thy <u>Resurrection</u>, // and the world <u>cel</u>ebrates Thy <u>rising</u> from the dead, O greatly <u>Mer</u>ciful One!

Having <u>fort</u>ified your soul with faith

I will be their God, and they shall be My people." Therefore "Come out from among them and be separate, says the Lord. Do not touch what is unclean, and I will receive you.
