Tone 2. Troparion of the Resurrection

WHEN <u>Thou</u> didst descend to death, O Life im<u>mor</u>tal, * Thou didst slay hell with the splendor of Thy <u>God</u>head. * And <u>when</u> from the depths Thou didst <u>raise</u> the dead, * all the powers of <u>heav</u>en cried out: // "O Giver of life, Christ our <u>God</u>, <u>glory</u> to Thee!"

Tone 4. Troparion of the church

TODAY the faithful celebrate the <u>feast</u> with <u>joy</u> * il<u>lum</u>ined by your coming, O <u>Mo</u>ther of God. * Beholding your pure image, we fervently <u>cry</u> to you: * Encompass us beneath the precious veil of your protection. * Deliver us from every form of <u>evil</u>, * by entreating Christ, your <u>Son</u> and our <u>God</u>, // that He may <u>save</u> our <u>souls</u>!

Tone 2. Troparion of Prophet Joel

EPISTLE

The Reading is from the Second Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians (11:31-12:9)

Brethren, the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who is blessed forever, knows that I am not lying. In Damascus the governor, under Aretas the king, was guarding the city of the Damascenes with a garrison, desiring to arrest me; but I was let down

It is doubtless not profitable for me to boast. I will come to visions and revelations of the Lord: I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago – whether in the body I do not know, or whether out of the body I do not know, God knows – such a one was caught up to the third heaven. And I know such a man – whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows – how he was caught up into Paradise and heard inexpressible words, which it is not lawful for a man to utter. Of such a one I will boast; yet of myself I will not boast, except in my infirmities. For though I might desire to boast, I will not be a fool; for I will speak the truth. But I refrain, lest anyone should think of me above what he sees me to be or hears from me. And lest I should be exalted above measure by the abundance of the revelations, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, a messenger of Satan to buffet me, lest I be exalted above measure. Concerning this thing I pleaded with the Lord three times that it might depart from me. And He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness." Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

GOSPEL

The Reading is from the Holy Gospel According to St. Luke (8:5-15)

The Lord spoke this parable, "A sower went out to sow his seed. And as he

sowed, some fell by the wayside; and it was trampled down, and the birds of the air devoured it. Some fell on rock; and as soon as it sprang up, it withered away because it lacked moisture. And some fell among thorns, and the thorns sprang up with it and choked it. But others fell on good ground, sprang up, and yielded a crop a hundredfold." When He had said these things He cried, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear!" Then His disciples asked Him, saying, "What does this parable mean?" And He said, "To you it has been given to know the mysteries of the kingdom of God, but to the rest it is given in parables, that 'Seeing they may not see, And hearing they may not understand.' Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. Those by the wayside are the ones who hear; then the devil comes and takes away the word out of their hearts, lest they should believe and be saved. But the ones on the rock are those who, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, who believe for a while and in time of temptation fall away. Now the ones that fell among thorns are those who, when they have heard, go out and are choked with cares, riches, and pleasures of life, and bring no fruit to maturity. But the ones that fell on the good ground are those who, having heard the word with a noble and good heart, keep it and bear fruit with patience.

Martyr Varus, and seven Monastic Martyrs with him

Martyr Varus lived in Egypt during the period of several persecutions against Christians (late third to early fourth century). Varus (Ouaros) was a military commander and secretly a Christian. He gave assistance to many of the persecuted and imprisoned Christians, and he visited the prisoners at night. He also brought food to the prisoners, dressed their wounds, and gave them encouragement.

Once Varus spent a whole night talking with seven imprisoned monks. These men were Christian teachers who had been beaten and starved. Varus marched with the teachers when they were led to their execution. The judge, seeing Varus' strong faith, had him fiercely beaten. Varus died during the beating. After his death, the monks were beheaded.

Screen El Tonto por Cristo


