Tone 1. Troparion of the Resurrection

WHEN the <u>stone</u> had been sealed by the <u>Jews</u>, * while the soldiers were guarding Thy most pure <u>body</u>, * Thou didst <u>rise</u> on the third day, O <u>Sa</u>vior, * granting <u>life</u> to the world. * The <u>powers</u> of heaven therefore cried to Thee, O <u>Giver</u> of Life: * "Glory to Thy Resur<u>rection</u>, O Christ! * <u>Glory</u> to Thy <u>Kingdom!</u> // Glory to Thy dispensation, O Thou Who <u>lovest</u> mankind!"

Tone 4. Troparion of the church

TODAY the faithful celebrate the <u>feast</u> with joy * il<u>lum</u>ined by your coming, O <u>Mo</u>ther of God. * Beholding your pure image, we fervently <u>cry</u> to you: * En<u>compass</u> us beneath the precious veil of your pro<u>tection</u>. * Deliver us from every form of <u>evil</u>, * by entreating Christ, your <u>Son</u> and our <u>God</u>, // that He may <u>save</u> our <u>souls</u>!

YOU shone <u>forth</u> with divine doctrine, eclipsing the deception of <u>Arius</u>, * O shepherd and initiate of the mysteries, <u>Am</u>brose. * You worked miracles through the power of the <u>Spirit</u>, * healing various <u>passions</u>; // righteous Father, entreat Christ our God to <u>grant</u> us His <u>great mercy</u>.

ON this day the Virgin cometh to the cave to give birth to * God the Word ineffably, * Who was before all the ages. * Dance for joy, O earth, on hearing * the gladsome tidings; * with the Angels and the shepherds now glorify Him * Who is willing to be gazed on * as a young Child Who * before the ages is God.

See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is. And do not be drunk with wine, in which is dissipation; but be filled with the Spirit, speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord.

A Letter from the President

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners,

I am grateful to share that St. Mary's just launched the Effective Parish Assessment (EPA) survey on December 6. This program—offered to us free of charge—will help us better understand our strengths and needs as a parish, especially as we face ongoing overcrowding during Divine Liturgy and fellowship hour and prepare for the growing number of children who will soon need classrooms and ministry space.

As we prayerfully consider the direction of our future capital campaign, it is essential that we make decisions rooted in real data, good stewardship, and the lived experience of our parishioners. The EPA survey will give us exactly that.

The survey takes 20–25 minutes, is entirely anonymous, and can be completed on any computer or smartphone. Volunteers will be available to help anyone who needs assistance accessing or navigating the survey.

Please take the time to participate by checking your email or scanning the code. Your voice matters, and your input will directly shape the future of St. Mary's.
