HYMNS OF THE DAY

Tone 2. Troparion of the Resurrection

WHEN Thou didst descend to death, O Life immortal, * Thou didst slay hell with the splendor of Thy Godhead. * And when from the depths Thou didst raise the dead, * all the powers of heaven cried out: // “O Giver of life, Christ our God, glory to Thee!”

Tone 2. Troparion of the Pentecostarion

THE noble Joseph, * when he had taken down Your most pure Body from the Tree, * wrapped it in fine linen and anointed it with spices, * and placed it in a new tomb. * But You rose on the third day, O Lord, // granting the world great mercy.

Same tone. Troparion of the Pentecostarion

THE Angel came to the myrrhbearing women at the tomb and said: * “Myrrh is fitting for the dead; * but Christ has shown Himself a stranger to corruption! * So proclaim: “The Lord is risen, // granting the world great mercy.”

Glory. Tone 2. Kontakion from the Pentecostarion.

YOU commanded the Myrrhbearers to rejoice, O Christ God. * By Your Resurrection, You stopped the lamentation of Eve, the first mother. * You commanded them to preach to Your Apostles: // “The Savior is risen from the tomb!”

Both now. Tone 8. Kontakion of Pascha

THOU didst descend into the tomb, O Immortal, * Thou didst destroy the power of death. * In victory didst Thou arise, O Christ God, * proclaiming, “Rejoice!” to the Myrrhbearing Women,// granting peace to Thine Apostles, and bestowing Resurrection on the fallen.

PROKEIMENON

In the sixth tone: O Lord, save Thy people, / and bless Thine inheritance!

∞ *To Thee, O Lord, will I call. O my God, be not silent unto me!*

EPISTLE

The Reading is from the Acts of the Holy Apostles (6:1-7)

In those days, when the number of the disciples was multiplying, there arose a complaint against the Hebrews by the Hellenists, because their widows were neglected in the daily distribution. Then the twelve summoned the multitude of the disciples and said, “It is not desirable that we should leave the word of God and serve tables. Therefore, brethren, seek out from among you seven men of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business; but we will give ourselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the word.” And the saying pleased the whole multitude. And they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, and Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas, a proselyte from Antioch,

whom they set before the apostles; and when they had prayed, they laid hands on them. Then the word of God spread, and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were obedient to the faith.

GOSPEL

The Reading is from the Holy Gospel According to St. Mark (15:43-16:8)

At that time, Joseph of Arimathea, a prominent council member, who was himself waiting for the kingdom of God, coming and taking courage, went in to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Pilate marveled that He was already dead; and summoning the centurion, he asked him if He had been dead for some time. So when he found out from the centurion, he granted the body to Joseph. Then he bought fine linen, took Him down, and wrapped Him in the linen. And he laid Him in a tomb which had been hewn out of the rock, and rolled a stone against the door of the tomb. And Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joseph observed where He was laid. Now when the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, that they might come and anoint Him. Very early in the morning, on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen. And they said among themselves, "Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb for us?"

But when they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away – for it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him. But go, tell His disciples – and Peter – that He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him, as He said to you." So they went out quickly and fled from the tomb, for they trembled and were amazed. And they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

INSTEAD OF IT IS TRULY MEET

The Angel cried to the Lady, full of grace: * "Rejoice, O pure Virgin! * Again, I say: Rejoice, * your Son is risen from His three days in the tomb! * With Himself He has raised all the dead." * Rejoice, O ye people!

Shine, shine, O new Jerusalem! * The glory of the Lord has shone on you. * Exult now, and be glad, O Zion! * Be radiant, O pure Theotokos, * in the Resurrection of your Son!

CPR & Basic Life Support Training @ St. Mary's

St. Mary Orthodox Church is offering Basic Life Support (BLS) and Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) certification classes through the American Red Cross in support of our developing Safety Ministry. As we are offering two distinct courses, here are the guidelines to choose the appropriate course:

- Select a BLS course registration if you are a current or former military member, law enforcement officer, or medical professional (as you already have the basic skills needed for this more advanced course).
- Choose a CPR course registration if you don't yet have basic certifications and/or you feel you need greater confidence or foundational skills in responding to emergencies. We also are reserving a few CPR seats for any youth preparing for a summer babysitting credential (which Caleb will post in the near future).

Participants must complete final registration through the Campaign Pay It Forward link provided through the [Realm link/QR code](#). These courses follow a blended learning format, requiring completion of an online portion prior to attending the in-person skills session at the parish. ***Note each link is unique to the class type and time. Be sure you use the link for the event in which you register**
